

IMMEDIATE RELEASE MADERA METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA (MSA) (Madera County)

The unemployment rate in the Madera County was 5.7 percent in April 2022, down from a revised 6.5 percent in March 2022, and below the year-ago estimate of 10.3 percent. This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 3.8 percent for California and 3.3 percent for the nation during the same period.
